







CHEROKEE RANCH TOUR AND LUNCH AT THE COUNTRY CLUB AT CASTLE PINES (RECAP) FROM DON BRADEN

June 30 was a beautiful, wind-free, sunny day for the trip to Cherokee Ranch and Castle in Sedalia. A total of 22 traveled up the winding, partially paved, back road to Cherokee Ranch and Castle in 12 different cars, sporting lots of Cadillac and Allanté finery, ready to begin our tour.

Our distinguished tour guides, John Lake, Tweet Kimball's former butler, and his wife Meg, formerly in charge of catering at the ranch, met us at the front porch. The house is an original design of a 1450's Scottish castle by noted Denver architect Burnham Hoyt. Construction began in 1924 and was completed 2 years later. My father was married in 1968 to the owner, Mildred Montigue Genevieve Kimball, nicknamed "Tweet" by her father. Yours truly lived and worked on the ranch with her sons, Kirk and Richard, that summer, following my graduation from the University of California at Santa Barbara, and the three of us stay in touch. My twin sister, Charlotte, and I attended the wedding ceremony that spring, which was held in the Great Hall, in front of the massive fireplace. Following their divorce in 1973, I was invited back many times by Tweet.

Following her first marriage, Tweet bought the property in 1954 from the Johnson family, the original owners, and established the first Rocky Mountain Santa Gertrudis purebred cattle business. The breed originated in Australia in the 1920's and was imported through the massive King Ranch in Texas. Predictions for her success were few in those days, especially about survival of the animals at altitude (6,500 feet at the Castle) and through the harsh Colorado winter, but Tweet persevered and made it work.



After a quick introduction about my connection to the ranch, including some lessons about cattle breeding from Denver's 1972 National Western Stock Show and Rodeo, we divided into 2 groups, one with John and one with Meg, for a room-by-room look at the history of the building and the many treasures of the place. Tweet, with a background in Art History from Bryn Mawr, lived in London following World War II with her first husband, Merritt Ruddock (U.S. diplomatic corps), knew classic pieces of art when she saw them and added them to her collection, including original artwork (Gainsborough, Rubens, Rembrandt, etc.), drawings, first editions, sculpture, furniture and so on. John and Meg were sure to cover the architectural and historical details in each room, from the outside porch to the unique dining room to the spectacular views from the

Rocky Mountain Room, including a long list of distinguished visitors and lavish parties at the castle.

We finished our tour in the crenellated tower, the very top of the house, with a spectacular view up and down the entire Front Range, from south to Pikes Peak, past Devil's Head and the Chatfield Reservoir and Dam, and north to downtown Denver. Tweet, who died in 1999, established a conservation easement for the 3,100-acre property for future generations to enjoy. We had some return visitors to the castle with us, and I am sure everyone enjoyed a unique experience.

From the ranch we traveled 8-10 miles to the Castle Pines Country Club to join a car show already in progress. We went to our exclusive parking





lot and met Director of Membership and Communications Brian Nishi, who personally directed us to our parking slots. Next to us was an eclectic selection of spectacular and exotic cars, foreign and American, including Porsche (several), Ferrari, Aston Martin (Rapide), MG, Mustang, Corvette and




Thunderbird ('55), spruced up and displayed, courtesy of country club members. I counted nine Cadillacs on display: my '50; Brad Bauer's '59; Nancy Tucker's '93 Allanté, John Cullinan's '70 Eldorado; Paula and Janice Olson's '66; Marv and Patti Mueller's '62 coupe; Ron and Linda Clubine's '76 Eldorado convertible; Bob and Marty Lyons '58 and Tim Coy's '02 Eldorado. Lots to see and do before lunch.



Under an enclosed tent, a short walk away, with another spectacular view of the Rocky Mountains, we found our catered buffet with all the trimmings, including 2 salads, a choice of lamb or salmon, carrots, broccoli, assorted vegetables and dessert, plus coffee and drinks from the bar, of course. We were not club members, but never knew the difference, and the food was plentiful and delicious. Just right for time together with other Cadillac club members, and the perfect spot to watch a storm gather and move on, with just enough precipitation to water the grass. A great end to a perfect day. 🚗
