An impromptu board meeting was held during the regular January meeting of the club at the Elk's Lodge. Walt Brewer had reported on how apprecia-

tive the participants and recipients of the Christmas Crusade for Children were of your generosity. Nancy Tucker read to us a letter of thanks from the Crusade. I called the board meeting so that we could vote on approving this same charity to receive our Christmas Fund money for 2010 also. It passed unanimously. Everyone in attendance was touched by what Walt had to say. Please join us at any meeting this year and bring along a few extra dollars or perhaps five, and donate it when we pass the hat.

Once again I have had starter problems on the Eldorado. The last time the man who rebuilt it found a faulty solenoid and replaced it. I suspect that when he found that he stopped looking. A year later I was having trouble again, so I took the starter to someone different, well recommended by a fellow member of our club. They told me the commutator was all but gone, which would certainly explain the trouble I was having. Rather than rebuild mine, they removed the nose piece from my starter and installed it on a motor they had already rebuilt. I attached it to the engine, but I wasn't comfortable with the results. The first try or two turning the ignition key resulted only in a click from the solenoid, but then the car did start. Something else must be wrong so I took the car to a shop for some diagnostic work. The first thing they did was test the battery. It was only a year old and an Optima at that. Sure enough, it had failed. I drove to my friendly, neighborhood NAPA and they gladly exchanged it

for a new one, agreeing that it was bad. Two starts later found me at the car wash. When I tried to start the car to pull into a bay it refused. I ended up having the car towed to a repair shop on south Broadway. They assured me the problem was the starter, so they removed it and I took it back to the rebuilder, who was skeptical. When I picked it up the next day they were most apologetic. There was indeed a short between the armature and the case, which caused the device to try to draw 800 amps! I wonder why my battery died. With a newly rebuilt unit in hand, I headed back to the repair facility. They installed starter number 2 and off I drove. Two starts later I was back. They once again assured me that it was the starter. I headed home to remove it myself, but called the rebuilder while on the way. He sincerely wanted to do whatever he could to make me happy, so I picked up another starter from him before giving him back number 2. Number 3 went in quickly and the car started beautifully three times. On the fourth start the solenoid did not disengage as it is designed to do. There was a loud scream from the starter, so I shut the car off as quickly as I could. That was the end of number 3. I returned number 2 to the rebuilder before removing number 3. He put a new, heavier duty solenoid on number 2 (now number 4), I swapped it with number 3 and life is good again. I can't help but wonder how long this will last. There is a momentary hesitation in my hand every time I turn the key, for fear it will click again. Pray for me.

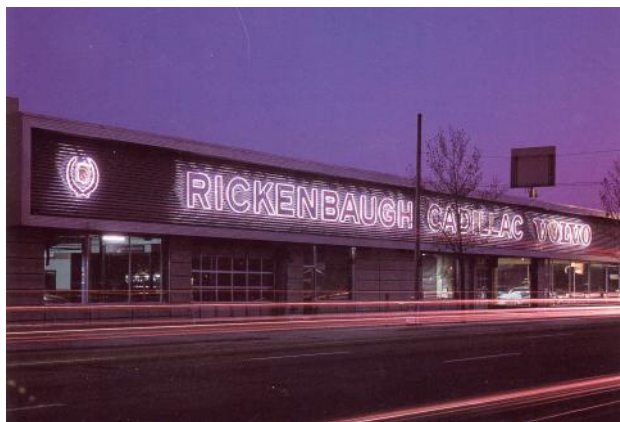
