

I learned recently that it is much easier to change spark plugs on one of our old cars than it is on a modern in-line 6 cylinder vehicle. It was time to replace the plugs on our '06 TrailBlazer. I think the rear plug is about half an inch in front of the radio. Five plugs were quite easy to change, but that last one wasn't much fun. First, I had to drop the plug socket down the hole, then drop the extension onto it and lock them together, then add the ratchet. The diameter and depth of the hole where the plug is located and the proximity of the cowl necessitated this. All the while my knees were hyper extended as I leaned in from the front bumper. Success was achieved and the car runs well. I'm glad I won't have to do that again for another 100,000 miles!

We'll meet at 8:30-8:45 a.m. in the parking lot at 32nd and Youngfield, on the northeast side of Applejack Liquors and in front of King Soopers. Departure will be promptly at 9:00, heading west on 32nd through Golden and north on scenic Highway 93.

For those folks who want to meet at the first stop..... we should arrive at the Shelby American Collection in Boulder at about 10:00 or shortly thereafter. It opens at 10:00. The address is 5020 Chaparral Court and admission is \$5. It has cars, history, memorabilia and you don't have to be a racing enthusiast to be impressed with the exhibit.

After about an hour we will drive 8 miles to the Dougherty Museum at 8306 N. 107th/Hwy 287 in southern Longmont. It opens at 11:00 and the admission is \$5. It houses a delightful private collection of antique autos, including four early 1900's Cadillacs, as well as phonographs, farm equipment, musical instruments and other memorabilia from long ago. I know it will be a delight!

After the museum, at about 1:00, we will drive a mile away to colorful Prospect and the Two Dog Diner which has a huge selection of delicious food. The tour ends there, but you may want to stay a little while afterwards to check out the colorful homes and little shops of Prospect.

Rambler Ranch Ramble By Jim Salmi

The world didn't end on Sunday, May 22, after all, so the benefit at the Rambler Ranch in Elizabeth proceeded on schedule. Although not a CLC club event, a few of our members and friends attended and enjoyed the event. I saw Marvin and Patty, and Jake Madsen's '41 Cadillac was on display. The benefit was for the Model A club, and was specifically intended for car club members, many of whom displayed vintage cars of various marques on the grounds of the Ranch. Many of our members have been to Rambler Ranch before, so they know how immense it really is. Privately owned by Terry Gale, who was on hand for questions, the collection reportedly runs in the neighborhood of four hundred cars, spread over multiple buildings and land. The main "garage" alone is 60'x300' and is currently holding 107 cars. Ambassadors, Americans, Gremlins, Hornets, Matadors, Javelins,

AMX's, Eagles, Concords, Alliances, and yes, Pacers, fill the buildings and parts and project cars spill out over the woods beyond. Everything for fans of the American Motors persuasion. The bulk of the cars are 1950's through 1980's vintage, although several as far back as the early thirties were on display as well. I had the impression that Terry bought many of the cars from estates when the getting was good, and only a minority are restored by him, although when you have a collection of four hundred cars, "minority" can still be a pretty big number. Although Nashes and their descendants are his focus, like any car guy he has other makes in the inventory, including Chrysler products, a Bricklin, Rolls Royce, a Packard, Edsels, and on and on. Nash also owned Kelvinator, after the founder of Kelvinator took over the helm of Nash conditioned on its purchase of Kelvinator so he wouldn't be away from his creation, and there is a beautiful collection of vintage Kelvinator refrigerators and appliances and an early fifties kitchen in the commissary area. And of course, there is plenty of petroliana, sales brochures, model cars, etc.



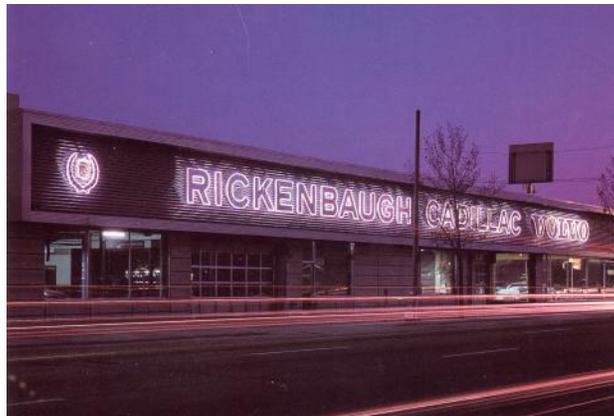
