FROM THE EDITOR:

WHO KNEW! (NOT CAR RELATED BUT INTERESTING)

COFFEE FILTER USES

You can buy 1,000 at the Dollar Store for \$1.00 even the large ones.

1. Coffee filters make excellent covers when cooking in the microwave.

2. Clean windows, mirrors, and chrome. Coffee filters are lint-free so they'll leave windows sparkling.

3. Protect China by separating your good dishes with a coffee filter between each dish.

4. Filter broken cork from wine. If you break the cork when opening a wine bottle, filter the wine through a coffee filter.



COLORADO SPRINGS/WWII MUSEUM TOUR

Our first tour of the year reaffirmed why we tour and the benefits of touring. We got our cars ready for a long drive after having sat for most of the winter and we saw a beautiful landscape as we cruised down a scenic road many of us had never been on. We also had the opportunity to visit historic sites most of us had never visited previously. But the best part of touring is the camaraderie.

We gathered on a beautiful, mild early spring day, Saturday, April 19 (Earth Day), at the Starbucks in the Aspen Grove Shopping Center on Santa Fe Drive in Littleton for our trip to Colorado Springs. Once we sorted our people from both the Packard Club and the Antique Auto Club of America (AACA), both ready at the same spot for different tours, we headed down highway 85 toward Sedalia, taking the scenic route 105 to Palmer Lake before joining I-25 at Monument.



Our First Stop, Rock Ledge Ranch is a 230-acre city park in Colorado Springs, just off the entrance to the Garden of the Gods and features the lifestyle and home of the Pikes Peak Region's early inhabitants, with assistance from exhibits and interpreters in period clothing. As you travel back in time, you begin with an authentic 1770's American Indian site, and an 1860 Homestead cabin. The cabin dates to the time of the Civil War, when Galloway homesteaded in the area. The Chambers family purchased the land in 1874 and built Rock Ledge House, a modern and very expensive undertaking for its day.

Docents greeted us at the door, invited us to tour the ground floor and explained how this Victorian period ranch worked. The multi-story house is notable for modern features of the day, including stone construction, wooden floors, a large bay window facing south and folding double doors between the dining room and the rest of the house. A grandmotherly docent in period dress, quietly seated in the rocking chair in the kitchen, next to an authentic family place setting for the next meal, explained the features of this 140 year old house and shared her own experiences with Art Culter and Don Braden as a one room school teacher in Rush, Colorado, 65 years ago.

Docents greeted us at the door, invited us to tour the ground floor and explained how this Victorian period ranch worked. The multi-story house is notable for modern features of the day, including stone construction, wooden floors, a large bay

This 1880's working farm includes animals, a fully stocked general store, restored barn, separate wood-working and blacksmith shops, complete with period woodworker, blacksmith and their tools.

General Palmer, credited as the founder of Colorado Springs, purchased the land around 1900 and 5 years later built a 3-story house of Cape Dutch design for his sister-in-law and her husband who had moved from South Africa to Colorado Springs. This house, staffed by 3-5 servants with their own live-in quarters, had all the modern features of the day, including steam heat (it was in operation) and was used by the Palmers as an exclusive location for entertaining guests and dignitaries. Different docents explained the rooms and features of the house, including the kitchen, complete with the original coal-fired stove and a meal in preparation.



We met club member Bill Woodman from Pueblo in his 1968 Eldorado and drove across town to The Airplane Restaurant, a converted Boeing KC-97 tanker. We arrived at just about noon and ordered a delicious lunch. It was served by the "flight crew," in uniform, either inside the fuselage, at booths next to large windows, or under the left wing, inside the building




that houses the plane, one of the largest piston aircraft ever built by Boeing. Lots of aviation history including pictures, memorabilia and rare artifacts.

We arrived at the National WWII Aviation Museum at 2 p.m., 27 strong, and met in a mock-up briefing room, reminiscent of the 8th Air force's Allied raids on Germany. Our docent, Jack Pasalevich, an F-102 pilot himself, told us about the history of World War II, especially the home front and the impact of technology on war preparation. He explained the mission of the Museum, including outreach to local schools, grades K-12, featuring programs aligned with Colorado State Standards (STEM: science, technology, engineering and math), using the history of WWII as the foundation.

A WWII airplane restoration shop is also housed at the Museum. Presently they are working on a P-38, a P-47 Thunderbolt, and a Navy Corsair. The planes in the museum all fly or are destined to play and the B-25 has been on several carriers and in the movie "Pearl Harbor" with Alex Baldwin playing Jimmie Doolittle. One of the members of our tour group had flown in WWII and the TBM Avenger Torpedo Bomber like he flew was in the museum exhibit.

I hope the photos of the tour will give you an idea of what we saw. We hope more of you can join us on future tours and events this year. Keep your motors running! 🚗


